## Where is a 560 MICR Code on a Check?

You will see the **560** MICR Code printed in the bottom left corner of the check. **560** MICR Code is a 9-digits code that you will see just before the account number on the check.

**Note:** This is not an actual check, the picture shown is just for illustration purposes.
